## "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

One of the exam questions asked at Confirmation Examination this year was, "What is your confirmation verse and why did you pick it? Of course, there was a day when the confirmands did not pick their verses, they were assigned. But these days we encourage the students to choose their own verse.

So in answering that question, Emily Hinrichs, our sole confirmand this year, answered with the Bible verse that serves as the headline for this article, Jeremiah 29:11. And the reason she chose it? Her aunt had given her a ring with those words engraved on it.

Through the suffering, death, and resurrection of the only begotten Son of God, Jesus Christ, we've got the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation, distributed in Word and Sacrament in the Holy Christian Church. We indeed are rescued.

May God grant that Emily, and all of us who once stood before the altar of God and confessed His saving name, would be reminded daily of His promise of the plans He has for us, plans to prosper us and not to harm us, plans to give us hope and a future.
