# Zion Lutheran Church Newsletter February 2023



Blessed Epiphany and Pre-Lententide! Now you might take pause at my greeting, because you may have never heard of "Pre-Lent." I don't blame you for not having known this term before now: I actually didn't grow up hearing such a phrase. That's probably mostly due to the fact that the term is just a familiar way of speaking of the weeks that lead up to the season of Lent that begins on Ash Wednesday.

To understand this, it's probably a good idea to take a step or two back. We would do well to examine, a bit, the Church's season of Lent. The term "lent" comes from an Old English word related to Spring – which makes some sense since the time of year is at the cusp of snow melting and April showers that bring those flowers the following months. But the Spanish, Portuguese, and other languages use an older term: *Cuaresma*, from the Latin *Quadragesima*, which means 40<sup>th</sup>. For centuries the Church then began calling the Sundays preceding Lent, *Septuagesima*, *Sexagesima*, and *Quinquagesima* (meaning 70<sup>th</sup>, 60<sup>th</sup>, and 50<sup>th</sup>, respectively).

So, other than for answering questions on a Latin quiz or a religious themed Jeopardy game, what use is the knowledge of this information? The reality is that it directs the eyes of the Church upon the greatest feast of the year – namely Easter (lasting 7 weeks and the highlight of the Christian life and the center of our hope for years ahead). The counting down to the celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord is an ever-present reminder that as we live our lives in repentant

faith, that the end of death and the devil is accomplished in Christ's glorious death and resurrection.

<sup>3</sup>Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? <sup>4</sup>We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

<sup>5</sup> For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. 6 We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. <sup>7</sup> For one who has died has been set free from sin. 8 Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. 9 We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. 10 For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. 11 So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus. (Romans 6:3-11)

Thus our Baptismal life is marked by these events of Christ and highlighted in our journey through the church year.

Both "Lent" and "Cuaresma" are fine terms, but the Latin languages, in this case, are better suited for the Church (in my humble opinion). Consider how many times the children around you in your lives might have asked how many days until Christmas? How many days until my birthday? How many times might you have pondered how many days there were until vacation or retirement or the upcoming wedding? How much more do we look forward to the celebration of our Lord's victory on our behalf?

Blessed Pre-Lent and Lententide.
