"Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice" LSB 556

Your may or may not remember singing this hymn several months ago. It was the Hymn of the Day for the Fifth Sunday of Easter. What you might remember about this hymn is that is has ten verses. And yes, we sang all ten of them. When singing our beautiful hymns, do you meditate on the words. I know that I don't always do that. My mind gets distracted. So I thought I would do a brief hymn study on this beautiful hymn. The following information is taken from Lutheran Service Builder "A Companion to the Hymns Volume 1.

This hymn was written by Doctor Martin Luther, probably in 1523, setting forth the indescribable grace of God and the true faith. "This Christian hymn by Doctor Martin Luther set the Reformation Gospel before the common people on the wings of song as a remarkably clear and complete summary of the Lutheran doctrine of justification."

Verse 1 sets the theme for the hymn by proclaiming the Reformation Gospel as a source of Easter joy. Verses 2 and 3 shift to recalling the reign of sin and death. These proclaim the Law in its full severity. Verses 4-6 proclaim the Gospel in all its sweetness. Verse 7 is the center

of the entire hymn as it frolics in the joyous exchange between the Bride and Bridegroom. The Christian's sin is laid on Christ, and Christ's righteousness is laid on the sinner. Verse 8 continues by describing the cost of Christ's own blood and proclaiming the promise that His victory has swllowed up death forever. Verses 9 and 10 conclude the hymn by pointing forward from faith's appropriation of Calvary's benefits toward the promise of the Holy Spirit, who will teach Christians to know the truth and will comfort them. Conversely, Christians are to guard themselves agiants human teachings lest this great Gospel treasure be destroyed.

I invite you to take time to read and meditate on the words of this hymn. It can be considered a sermon set to music. Corinne Mankin

- Dear Christians, one and all rejoice,
 With exultations springing,
 And with united heart and voice
 And holy rapture singing,
 Proclaim the wonders God has done,
 How His right arm the vict'ry won.
 What price our ransom cost Him!
- 2 Fast bound in Satan's chains I lay;

 Slay bitter death for them that they

 May live with You forever."

 Was born of virgin mother;
 And God's good pleasure to fulfill,
 He came to be my brother.
 His royal pow'r disguised He bore;
 A servant's form, like mine, He wore
 To lead the devil captive.
- 7 To me He said: "stay close to Me, I am your rock and castle.
 Your ransom I myself will be;
 For you I strive and wrestle.
 For I am yours, and you are Mine,
 And where I am you may remain;
 The foe shall not divide us.
- 8 "Though he will shed My precious blood, Me of My life bereving.
 All this I suffer for your good;
 Be steadfast and believing.
 Life will from death the vict'ry win;
 My innocence shall bear your sin,
