Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

On the night in which Christ is betrayed a lot is recorded for us as to what happens: Our Lord washes the Apostles' feet showing His coming in humble service to His creation; He speaks words of comfort and instruction to the 12 (especially as relates to the giving of the Holy Spirit and the work He will accomplish); and, perhaps most memorably, He institutes the Lord's Supper and the eating and drinking of Christ's Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins. But in that upper room we are also given words that Jesus prays to the Father. These encompass nearly the whole of John chapter 17.

Of the notable things in this prayer from God the Son to God the Father is the fact that Christ is praying not only for those there gathered (who will soon be scattered, only to be gathered again through the Spirit and scattered into the world to preach the Good News of His life, death, and resurrection as eyewitnesses), but that our Lord is praying for us also.

²⁰ "I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, ²¹ that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. ²² The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, ²³ I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. (John 17:20-23)

This unity for which Christ prays for us is the related to the unity that Father, Son, and Holy Spirit share. The three persons of the Godhead

are one, and there is one God yet there are three distinct persons of the Holy Trinity. Without delving deeper than God reveals this mystery, our Lord's prayer means at least this: Jesus brings us into communion with Himself in the Trinity (We have unity with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.); He imparts to us His glory (We are being conformed to His image and granted His righteousness and His kingdom); and we are brought into unity with one another (made one body; our Lord's one Holy Bride; and brothers and sisters in Him).

These are surely mysteries too deep to grasp fully this side of our resurrection, but we have the answer to Christ's prayer delivered in His own actions of bleeding, dying, rising, and ascending in glory. We have the words which underly the unity with the Triune God as Jesus speaks, "Peace be with you," breathing the Holy Spirit upon His Church; we have the forgiveness of sins, which underlies this peace spoken, with the authority of Christ in His Church; and we have the Holy Spirit who is sanctifying us as He dwells in the baptized, causing us to strive against the devil and our sinful flesh, forgiving one another, and desiring to be in unity with God's Holy Word and His teachings.

All of this is celebrated in the meal our Lord established in remembrance of Him (that is, in what He has done to set us free from separation from God and discord in our midst). Here we repent of false teaching and approach in communion with one another in the truth confessed together; we receive the forgiveness of sins in faithful eating and drinking; we gather together in the unity Christ prays for as often as we can; and we receive the Body and Blood of our Lord and Savior in unity with God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

To be sure, this is but a foretaste of the fullest revelation of this on the final and eternal day to come, but it is certainly a "Yes!" in answer to Christ's prayer that our Triune God is giving to us. May we be emboldened to come in repentant faith, lay aside all excuses and sinful causes of division, and bask in the mysterious unity, glorious hope, and communion of saints that is delivered and revealed at the Lord's table - you are the beloved of the Lord with each of the beloved gathered with you.


